True Confessions were too numerous to track - thanks for all the contributions!

President Pete introduced Immediate Past President **Nita Sell**, Certified Financial Planner with Montauk, who began the program and introduced the other participants, **Dorothy Lewis**, **Nick Rajacich**, and his wife, Melinda, **Fred Moisio**, **Jan Schwenger** and **Don Hansen**. The volunteers who traveled to Africa were aglow with the fellowship they created and the humanitarian work they provided. They presented a few photos and a lot of information about their adventure. We were all invited to consider taking part in the future in one of two trips per year that will be planned.

The situation for Ethiopians is dire. They struggle to survive and are plagued with cholera, fistula, and starvation. Rotarians and other groups have been able to provide support in the form of clean water, a fistula hospital, food, clothes and, of course, polio vaccinations, and there is evidence of the impact of the humanitarian efforts.

No children under 5 are presenting with polio at hospitals, and 1200 surgeries a year address fistula, saving the lives of women and integrating them back into their communities. Although the hospital is a blessing, it will take 180 years at the rate of 1200 surgeries per year to help all of the women who are burdened with this birth-related circumstance.

The very positive effects of time, attention and money was also evident to our group when they were met by 24 vibrant little pre-schoolers who welcomed our troop with songs and invited them to see their new school environment. It must have been a huge relief

to see something working that well, since the high schoolers aren't doing so well. Special thanks went to Kathryn Nelson and Mary Jo Strom-Copland who personally donated \$2000 to be used by our travelers. Fortunately our group is now known as the Tacoma Rotarianators ... they ended their presentation with "We'll be back." The world is hoping so; there is important work to do.

President Pete gave thanks to the WCS Committee for their presentation and announces a \$25 donation to RI Foundation. He then announced next week's meeting with fitness expert Ogie Shaw who will be present "Fitting Fitness Into Your Schedule." Then we got the big ole reminder about the social today at CI Shenanigan's, 3017 Ruston Way.

He waved goodbye, reminded us to... *Share Rotary and Have Fun While We Get Things Done!* and clanged the bell again at a little after 1:00.
