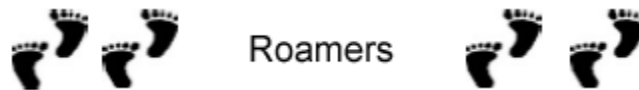

We learned a lot about Brazil, and what struck me most was how much like America it is. From industries to important causes, Brazil and America are quite similar. In a couple of areas, however, it seems they are leading the way, and perhaps we could learn a lesson or two. For example, flex fuel - just about all the cars in Brazil run off this stuff. This means they can run off gasoline or a blend of ethanol. (I tried Wesson in my Nissan this weekend, bad idea!)

No hanging chads - on the election side, people in Brazil are required to vote. How democratically un-democratic! Technically, this is called Compulsory Voting, and if you don't vote, you could be subject to fines, community service, or imprisonment. At first, I thought this sounded harsh. But then, as I looked back on the history of America, I wondered how many people who didn't vote at some point in time felt "imprisoned" by the policies of the person elected and subjected to "fines" in the manner of taxes for programs of which there weren't in favor. (I'm still reaching for community service "twist" on this, work with me!) More impressive, though, is the fact that in Brazil, election results are all computerized and results are posted in about 24 hours. (Oh, so many directions I could with go this one...)

The GSE Team finished up their presentation with a nice rendition of the Girl from Ipanema. I realized that English and Portuguese are pretty different languages, but in both languages, "aahhhhhh" is pronounced exactly the same!

Eduardo Antonietto brought it all home by playing his guitar and singing in his native tongue. Note to **Josh Waltier** - you're a physical therapist, do you play guitar like that?
