into online activities of child predators in several countries.

Linda has provided online safety consulting and training to executives and product teams across the technology industry. In addition, she has provided advisory services to numerous government organizations in the United States and internationally preparing online safety regulations and legislation. She is currently advising England's House of Lords Technology Committee.

Criddle has written *Internet Safety for Educators*, a distance learning course for Washington State University. Her company, LOOKBOTHWAYS is currently creating a fully integrated K-12 curriculum for schools across the US. A second book targeting teaching the industry how to build safer software and services is underway.

Linda is an active single mother of four, who grew up in California, then lived and worked in Kristiansand, Norway for 15 years before returning to the states and joining Microsoft. In Norway, she was active in city politics and a member of the Kristiansand City Council. During that time she began her advocacy work for women and children's rights, leveraging both her political position and her journalist background to call for the funding of abuse hotlines and crisis shelters. This work inspired her research into predatory behavior, methods, and mindsets, a field she has tracked and researched for more than 20 years.

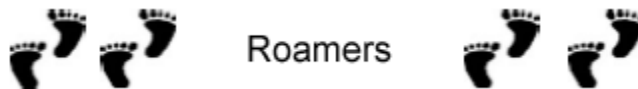

Water Resources Group

PDG Dr. Arvind Phukan P.E. has been appointed by RI President Wilf Wilkinson as Zone 23 Coordinator, Water Resources Group for 2007-08. Zone 23 consists of 12 districts, including our District 5020, and 693 Rotary Clubs located in Washington, British Columbia, Canada, Oregon and California. "If the wars of this century were fought over oil, the wars of the next century will be fought over water." *Ismail Serageldin*, World Bank VP, 1995. Serageldin has been proven correct much faster than he or anyone else thought. Water has emerged as a key issue in the 21st century. The U.N. Millennium Development Goal (MDG) seeks to cut by 50% the 2.5 billion people without access to safe water and sanitation facilities. About 5,000 children (under age 5) die from infectious diarrhea acquired from unsafe drinking water. To aggressively work towards the common U.N. MDG goal, RI has created the Water Resources Group which will spearhead and support Rotary's efforts to address this important global issue. Rotary's goals for 2007-08 are for every Rotarian to become aware of world water issues and for every Rotary Club to implement a water resource project.

A Fun Excursion to Portland

Once again we are considering a trip to Portland. The dates would be November 2, 3, and 4. We will take Amtrak from Tacoma to Portland on Friday afternoon, grab a bite to eat and then take the trolley to Portland Improv (we'll ask them to save us front row seats again). Saturday will give us time to visit the Portland Art Museum, shop and have dinner at a nice restaurant before attending *The Underpants* (adapted by Steve Martin) at the Portland Center Stage. Sunday will find us sleeping in and then lunching before going to the World Trade Center for Coco Bliss and her one-person performance of skits and songs in *Chocolate Confessions*. Afterwards actress Joan Freed (Coco Bliss) and her husband will join us for dessert at The Heathman before we move on to Powell's Book Store. We will Amtrak back to Tacoma on Sunday evening.

Details:

We will look for hotel booking via The Portland Big Deal (starts in mid-September) for hotel rooms, which usually offers \$20 off per night, a continental breakfast for two, wine tasting in the evening and free overnight parking. FYI: I don't think we've ever had time for the free wine tasting. The Improv has accommodated us twice before by holding our seats allowing us to waltz in just before curtain time for our front row seats. They should be able to do this again.

Peg and I saw *The Underpants* at A.C.T. in Seattle and it was hilarious. In this side-splitting reinvention of a turn-of-the-century German sex comedy (if you can imagine a German sex comedy), the incomparable Steve Martin (yes, that Steve Martin) focuses his zany eye on the relationship between a prudish butcher and his delectably voluptuous young wife, Louise. Set in 1910, when a glimpse of stocking was something shocking, two very different men face cardiac arrest when they are witness to the full descent of the luscious Louise's lingerie during an outdoor celebration. Louise becomes something of an instant celebrity and a magnet for romantic intrigue in this hilarious, frothy, naughty comedy.

At the Art Museum there will be two exhibits. In presenting some

60 drawings, prints, and artist books, mainly from the Museum's collection, *Graphic Force*, *Humanist Vision* reveals the immediacy and poignancy of Leonard Baskin's artistic legacy: the common consciousness of humankind. Highlighting the creative collaboration between the artist and master printers, *Chuck Close Prints* demonstrates the ways in which the artist has challenged the accepted boundaries of the printmaking tradition.

In *Chocolate Confessions* we'll be welcomed to the chocolate shop of Coco Bliss, where a mixed assortment of hilarious customers share their deep, dark secrets. In this one-woman musical comedy, you'll meet over a dozen unique characters and hear amusing anecdotes about chocolate, like how M&M candies came to be, the surprising origins of the chocolate chip cookie and a courtroom drama of chocolate on trial for its sins. *Chocolate Confessions* has appeared in 25 cities across the country with rave reviews.
