

Projects underway in 2007-2008 include a complete remodel of Bellevue Square as well as an expansion of the shopping center to include a village of luxury boutiques. An expansion of the Hyatt Regency Hotel will also begin in 2007 adding 351 guest rooms, as well as additional meeting and banquet space. A third mixed-use project is planned on the site to the south of Lincoln Square in the near future.

Kemper Freeman is a past Chairman of the International Council of Shopping Centers. Mr. Freeman is the current chairman of the association's Government Relations Committee and has served as a Trustee since 1987. He is a former Washington State Legislator, and has served on the boards of numerous business and civic organizations.

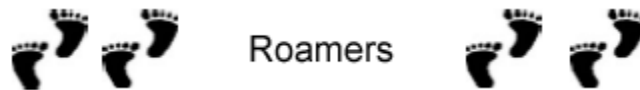

Circle Your Calendar for The Naval Undersea Museum

The Rotary program for **May 17** features Admiral Bruce Harlow discussing the wonders of the Naval Undersea Museum which is located at Keyport near Silverdale. The goal of the museum is to preserve, collect and interpret Naval undersea history, science and operations for the benefit of the US Navy and the people of the United States.

Actually, The Naval Undersea Museum is a two-parter. In an effort to show our kids and grandkids some of the educational opportunities involved with oceanic studies, the Program Committee is recommending a special bus trip (box lunch) from Tacoma to Keyport on **May 19**. We are trying to arrange a special boating demonstration for kids of all ages where the participants have a chance to explore the bottom of Puget Sound and retrieve wildlife from our local depths.

The Naval Undersea Museum offers educational programs throughout the year for people of all ages ranging from grade school students to adults.

The Education Department serves students in public and private schools as well as those in home school programs. Student programs include focus tours, art and construction projects, films and gallery tours. The museum also participates in special area-wide programs such as Washington Water Weeks and Kids Adventures.

The Rotary Museum trip should be loads of fun. The ocean environment lets visitors experience the remarkable and limitless diversity of the world that lies beneath the sea. Using hands-on activities, visitors learn about the physical properties of the ocean such as buoyancy, pressure, density, heat transfer, light, sound, salinity, and oxygen. A microscope with slides of sea creatures such as starfish and diatoms lets children and adults see some of

the fascinating creatures which make up the web of life in the ocean. The exhibit includes a video of the mysterious black smokers and tube worms from the Juan de Fuca Ridge, 300 miles from the coast of Washington State.

Currently complete, and open to the public, is a simulation of the control room of the nuclear fast attack submarine, Greenling (SSN 614), which was decommissioned in 1994. The museum has installed major equipment such as periscopes, ship control panel, and ballast control panel from the Greenling in a simulation of Greenling's control room.

Outside Exhibits include:

Deep Quest, the Navy's research submersible which explored the ocean to a depth of 8,000 feet. This submersible was used to retrieve an atomic warhead off the coast of Spain.

Trieste II (DSV-I), the deep submergence vehicle which descended to 20,000 feet and was used to explore the Marianna Trench.

Randy Melquist, Chartered Life Underwriter, Mass Mutual Financial Group, put our birthday celebrants on the spot by asking them questions about the Museum of Glass website which is chock full of information you need to visit, understand the hot shop process, see which artists will be visiting, find out about attending their 10 part lecture series on the history of glass, get directions, find out their hours, and learn more about this jewel of our community. Thanks Randy for promoting more about the Museum in a really fun way!

After True Confessions, Tim Close, Director and CEO of the Museum of Glass, shared the exciting happenings at the Museum. The Museum of Glass provides a dynamic learning environment to appreciate the medium of glass through creative experiences, collections and exhibitions. Visitor traffic is very near to reaching the 1 million mark and membership is up by more than double in the last two years. Opening June 16 this year, the Museum will organize an exhibit called Mining Glass to commemorate its 5th year of operation. The exhibit is sponsored by a mix of local and national supporters: The Paul G. Allen Family Foundation, Russell Investment Group, Click! Network, and the National Endowment for the Arts. If you are an enthusiast, Director Close advised us to be sure to check out the schedule for the 2007 Visiting Artist Summer Series beginning June 13, 2007. Tim shared with us the many ways the Museum District adds to the richness of our community through art and commerce and estimates the MOG provides a \$70 million financial impact. Tim says their annual budget is at \$5.3 million and they earn half of that through revenues and the other half through contributions. It was all very interesting and increased our level of appreciation for this oddly shaped, glittering, attention-getting jewel of a landmark...but, the best was yet to come when Tim handed over the podium to Susan Warner who led us through the process of designing our own glass piece that will now be commissioned for production and donated to the next Rotary auction. It was most titillating for us and it's exciting to anticipate what it will look like. Susan led us in a democratic process to choose the shape, the accoutrements and the color of the piece. Be looking for it next year!

It was really fun to be at the Museum again, I've taken many out-of-towners to see the spectacle of the bridge, and I'll keep on doing so! See you next week!
